Vision:

Start Your Engines!

These six economic engines should be supported through the efforts of City Hall and partners in the community. These are areas where a stall would see significant impact to the economy, and therefore where leadership is required. These are the engines that will raise the tide and all the boats. These engines – well greased – will also help to stimulate growth in retail, arts and culture and other sectors that contribute to quality of life, well-being and happiness of Victorians.

Each engine is supported by objectives, goals that the City will work towards to ensure the ongoing functionality of the six engines.

A) Advanced Education and Research & Development

75% of all students in the region come from outside it, how many people stay? How many of their parents invest here?

- 1. Increase in the number of graduates who can find meaningful work in Victoria post-graduation
- 2. The City leads stronger, close, action-orientated collaborations between postsecondary institutions, the local economy and the community
 - a. Retain the impacts of the commercialization of the research and development
 - b. Pathways to meaningful careers
 - c. Researching the questions that matter to the community and lead to action

B) Ocean and Marine Sector

Currently represents 6-8% of the region's GDP, regionally more people are employed in this sector than in the government sector (3.7% location quotient). Companies include Ralmax, Seaspan, Ocean networks Canada etc.

Objectives to be developed at the July 10th meeting (following homework assigned June 26):

C) Experiential Tourism

- 1. 72% hotel room occupancy on a sustained basis
 - i. Victoria is a year-round destination
- 2. Establish Victoria as a boutique cruise homeport
- 3. Increase the number of businesses and events that offer authentic, only in Victoria product and unique experience

D) Government

The economic engine of government employs approximately 13,000 people in the region directly and 7,000 in indirect employment. Government office space rental accounts for 60% of all office space in the region. As the capital city, it is possible to take advantage of the incubation possibilities that being the seat of the provincial government offers.

- 1. Recruit and steward government in Victoria
- 2. Realize the potential for land and infrastructure opportunities that overlap with Provincial interests.
 - i. These interests include
 - a. Read lot
 - b. Belleville
 - c. Ships Point
 - d. General infrastructure
- 3. Create incubator with the Provincial government
