Do you feel the proposed multi-use pathway through Beacon Hill Park is a good investment of the funds being contributed by the CRD Wastewater Treatment Project for community improvements in your neighbourhood, why or why not?

No, not at all.

The project should proceed on its own merit not on the availability of funds.

The current path meets the needs of the students as it is. The only impediment is the "no cycling" on the path. That is ignored at BAM by the current users.

The proposed path dead-ends at Heywood and Oliphant. That is not a situation that will be tolerable to most users. The path will eventually be extended north on Heywood Ave on the east side through a very swampy area.

Please let us know if you have any additional comments:

From my experience cycling through the park, most cyclists travelling east will not use the proposed path but will continue along Bridge Way past the washrooms then find other routes to Cook St.

The path is proposed to be 2.7 metres wide which will impact the Heywood Meadow. That meadow has significant heritage value as stated in the BHP Heritage Management Plan 2003.
