




- Local grass-roots group

Why are we here?





- To make it legal to live full time in moveable tiny houses
 - As alternatives to garden suites
 - In clusters
 - As in-fill dwellings
 - As laneway homes

Who wants a tiny home?







- Younger singles, couples, families
- Older singles, couples
- Constrained by ultra-low vacancy rate & high rents
- Can't afford a conventional home but...
- ...Do not want to be a financial burden or carry one

Social Advantages







- Affordable housing option
- Aging in place option
- Green, sustainable living
- Use less water and power
- TH owners have more discretionary income to spend in the community
- Frees up conventional rental inventory

Financial Advantages





- TH owners bring their own home
- Property owner investment \$4K-\$10K = quick ROI
- Annual permit fee can
 offset any municipal costs
- Allows increased density with small municipal infrastructure investment

What is a tiny house?





- < 400 sq ft (ICC 2017)
- Sits on a trailer or foundation
- Built with same methods and materials as a conventional house
- Designed for safety and permanency
- Built to last for decades

What is a tiny house?







- Can be moved
- Often built or supervised by certified contractors
- Increasingly built by companies specializing in tiny home construction
- Usually custom designed

A moveable tiny house is not...






- A manufactured home
- A park model trailer
- A mobile home
- A conventional RV






Building codes options
