Preliminary research indicates that Robert Street may be significant for the connection between the lot subdivision pattern and the Muirhead Family estate, the area's representative examples of war-time housing, including examples of the English storybook style and turn-of-the century architecture.

If an HCA by-law were passed, it would establish conservation guidelines and a permit process to ensure the long term stability of the area. Work that could then require authorization through a heritage alteration permit would include changes to the appearance of key historic features on the primary elevation of buildings, the subdivision of lots and the construction of a new building or an addition.
