Engagement Summary Report

JUNE - SEPTEMBER 2018



Introduction

Centennial Square was identified as a priority public space for improvement through community input received as part of the development of the City's Downtown Public Realm Plan in 2017. The community expressed a desire to see the Square enhanced to be a more vibrant, accessible, inclusive and utilized public space.

In 2018, staff began work to develop an action plan for Centennial Square to identify short, medium, and long-term improvements for the Square.

Three phases of public engagement were planned to support the Centennial Square Action Plan. The first phase was completed between June and September 2018 and focused on identifying high level themes, and community feelings, ideas and desired experiences for Centennial Square. It focused on identifying what people liked, disliked or felt needed to be improved in the Square and gave citizens an opportunity to identify the types of experiences they would like to have in Centennial Square.

The next two engagement phases that were planned for late 2018 and early 2019, but not completed include:

- ➤ Public input on emerging ideas, draft design concept options, programming recommendations and priorities (planned for late 2018)
- Review of the draft Centennial Square Action Plan (planned for 2019)

More than 1,500 participants provided input from June through September 2018. Input was received through an online survey, pop up engagement stations at events in Centennial Square, two stakeholder working group workshops and an open house event at City Hall that explored possible design solutions for Centennial Square.

The top themes identified by the community through engagement include:

- > a desire to see Centennial Square become more inviting and welcoming for families
- > a desire for more year-round programming in Centennial Square
- interest in having more vendors and/or changes to the ground-level use in the buildings surrounding the Square
- > safety concerns, especially at night, in the Square

Engagement Approach

Engagement was designed to support the project with three phases of engagement. Community input opportunities were designed to expand on the strategies for Centennial Square identified in the City's Downtown Public Realm Plan to better understand how the community would like to experience Centennial Square to inform future design improvements.

The Downtown Public Realm Plan's strategies to bring more vibrancy to Centennial Square include:

- Increase ground-level commercial and cafe/restaurant space in the area
- Facilitate temporary installations such as cafe kiosks or food trucks in the Square

- Improve the Square's connections with Douglas Street
- Incorporate play elements to make the space welcoming for children and families
- Introduce new surface material to complement the existing heritage brick

A Centennial Square stakeholder Working Group was established to gather input from 16 key stakeholder groups and to identify common challenges and opportunities for the Square in its current state and possibilities for the future. Participants included representation from arts and festival groups, downtown residents, walkability and placemaking groups, business groups, tourism, and heritage. The stakeholder working group's involvement was designed to be at the Involve and Collaborate levels on the International Association of Public Participation (IAP2) guide for public participation, following the principles and practices outlined in the City's Engagement Framework.

Engagement with the wider community consisted of in-person events and an online survey to raise awareness about the project and collect input from the community to identify key themes in how the community would like to experience Centennial Square, and key themes to guide future improvements to the Square. Engagement with the public during this phase was designed and conducted at the Involve and Consult levels on the International Association of Public Participation spectrum (IAP2).

Engagement Highlights:

- > 479 responses from people at pop up events in the Square
- > 1,005 survey responses
- > 20 different stakeholder groups involved through the Working Group and one-on-one meetings
- 12 design ideas/solutions informed by public and stakeholder input from an "Ideas Jam"

What We Did

Engagement included:

- A workshop with the stakeholder Working Group to identify key themes in June
- Five pop up events in Centennial Square in July
- An online survey that collected input throughout July
- > One-on-one meetings with key stakeholder groups including McPherson Theatre, Accessibility Working Group, and Heritage Advisory Panel
- > Youth engagement with UVIC Urban Geography students and Youth Council
- An Ideas Jam workshop with the stakeholder Working Group followed by an open house event to continue the input and discussions with the community at City Hall in September
- Online engagement through Twitter, Facebook and Instagram throughout July and September

June

The first workshop with the stakeholder working group took place at City Hall in June 2018. This workshop included sharing information about the history of the creation of Centennial Square and a collaborative group exploration of the current challenges, strengths and opportunities that exist for

Centennial Square in its current state. In groups of 7-10 people, each table discussed Centennial Square's challenges with representatives each providing their unique perspectives on what could be improved on.

July

Five "pop-up" engagement stations were held at high-attendance events in Centennial Square including Folktoria, Eventide, Festival Mexicano, Vegtoria, and a free lunchtime concert. Attending events in the Square provided an opportunity for staff to interact with hundreds of people and answer their questions about the project. Citizens were invited to share their input on a sounding board to identify the types of experiences they would like to see more of in Centennial Square. Participants also provided additional ideas and feedback regarding Centennial Square.

An "Ideas Jam" with the stakeholder Working Group was held in September. This second workshop brought the Working Group members together to review key themes identified by the wider community during pop up engagement events and through the online survey. In groups, members worked with a consultant and staff design team to explore possible design solutions for Centennial Square. The design team further developed the ideas to create a more visual representation of improvement options for the Square which were shared with the stakeholder Working Group and public for further discussion and input. The Ideas Jam resulted in 12 different ideas for improvements to the Square.



Additional one-on-one meetings with the City of Victoria's Youth Council, a class from the University of Victoria's Urban Geography program, the Accessibility Working Group, the City's Heritage Advisory Panel, McPherson Theatre staff, and the Downtown Victoria Business Association were held.

Further collaboration with the stakeholder Working Group was planned for the second and third phases of engagement. The next steps would have also involved one-on-one meetings with key stakeholder from the Working Group and other organizations followed by engagement on preferred concepts and solutions with the Working Group and the public.

Additional engagement that was planned to take place later in 2018 included consultation with Songhees and Esquimalt Nations through the City Family, engagement with youth through the Youth Empowerment Society, further engagement with the Downtown Residents Association, and follow up and one-on-one meetings with all organizations involved with the stakeholder Working Group to involve their wider network of staff/members.

Pop-Up Events in Centennial Square

Events in Centennial Square engaged with 479 people at popular events in the Square. Attendance at these events was diverse. Participants included residents of Victoria, residents of downtown, residents from other municipalities across the region, business owners and people who work downtown, visitors to Victoria, and festival organizers and vendors.

Online Survey

The online survey received more than 1,000 responses and included questions to help identify some of the demographics of those who completed the survey:

- 65% of survey respondents identified as living in a City of Victoria neighbourhood
- 35% identified as living outside of the City of Victoria/another municipality
- In terms of age, 59% of those who completed the survey identified as 39 years of age or younger
- 72% of respondents noted they visit or pass through the Square at least a few times a month, with 42% saying they visit or pass through the Square at least once a week

What We Heard

Stakeholder Working Group workshop #1 (June 2018)

In table groups participants explored the current challenges and opportunities for Centennial Square. The workshop wrapped up with each table sharing their top three ideas for short-term improvements. These included:

Better amenity offerings	Retail or café space in or on the edges of the Square. These would give people more reasons to come to the Square and stay longer in the square and could also help concerns related to safety as people in the café/restaurant later in the day would equal more eyes/people in the area.
Improve cohesiveness	The Square feels disjointed and needs to feel like a more unified space. This could be achieved through improvements to landscaping, accessibility and wayfinding.
Fountain improvements	The fountain is intended to be the heart of square but cannot be fully enjoyed in its current state. A water feature that is inviting and enjoyable to all would improve the space.
Improve flexibility and openness	Remove or refit the fountain to allow access and playfulness. Flat water area for events and better set up.

Provide more passive programming	Allow for more interesting seating options, more intimate activities, and retail
Rethink undercroft area	Convert the undercroft into a more interactive space.
Clean up area and increase maintenance	Do better maintenance in the Square. In addition to power washing, clean the facades of the buildings and make it more appealing.
Improve connection to Douglas Street	Open up the entrance from Douglas Street and allow better pedestrian flow. Invite people in.
Revitalize edges of the Square.	Create a gateway and welcoming feature from Broad Street with programming in the undercroft, introducing retail. Use space for exhibitions, refresh the space, add more lighting.

Pop-Up Events and Survey (July 2018)

Through one-on-one conversations and input on sounding boards, feedback through social media channels, stakeholder meetings, and the online survey, several common themes emerged, which are outlined below.

Overall high-level themes identified through engagement:

- A desire to see the space become more inviting and welcoming for families
- Measures to make the space feel safer and more inclusive
- A desire for more year-round programming
- A desire for more vendors and/or changes to ground level use

Pop Up Events (July 2018)

During engagement events in the Square, there was also strong support to experience the Square for:

- Large scale events and concerts
- Winter markets
- Festivals and food trucks
- Outdoor movies
- Buskers
- Local events and markets

Online Survey (July 2018)

The online survey identified strong support to experience the Square for:

- Community gathering space
- Regular farmers markets
- Shaded tree areas with tables for lunch and visiting
- Outdoor public art
- Seating, elements or art that is playful
- Winter markets

Ideas Jam Workshop (September 2018)

The Ideas Jam brought together the Working Group, general public, and a staff and consultant design team for a two-day workshop event. The workshop explored preliminary design possibilities to improve the Square and achieve community desires identified through earlier community input.

The two-day event began with a collaborative design session with the Working Group to establish a set of design directions to guide the development of concepts and options by the staff and consultant design team. At the end of the second day, design concepts and options developed were shared with the public and working group members for further input and feedback.

Design ideas were premised on restoring the original intent of the Square as the City's main civic gathering space while supporting its evolution as a venue for events and festivals, and creating a more fun, inclusive and welcoming space for people of all ages and abilities.

The workshop resulted in six possible design directions and 12 emerging ideas informed by public and stakeholder input including:

- Improvements to create a more welcoming entrance into the Square from Douglas Street that would also support more flexible programming and event space
- Improvements to accessibility and connections through the Square with simplified, continuous grades
- > Options for improving the fountain and central plaza area
- ➤ Ideas for supporting more year-round and daily activity in the Square through improvements to the undercroft area (covered passage to Pandora Avenue), stage area and buildings alongside the Fisgard parkade
- Options for supporting programming in the undercroft through an open air or public art gallery or creation of a partially enclosed civic room with flexible uses
- Ways to support Centennial Square as an inviting urban green with opportunities for trees and lawn for relaxing or shady places to sit and enjoy lunch




Idea 4: Contemporary seating added to fountain and pool replaced with water jets with access for waterplay


Idea 7: Undercroft area adapted for included or semi enclosed pavilion




Idea 8: Improvements to existing or redeveloped building on north side of Square




Idea 9: Partially enclose undercroft and add seating for flexible uses

Idea 12: Hardscape plaza at Douglas Street and improve green space adjacent to theatre






Next Steps



Q1 When you think about Centennial Square as a heart for downtown, what gives it that "heart"? Choose an image that most reflects the type of experience that makes it a special place (select one).





Q2 What types of celebration would you like in Centennial Square? Choose an image that reflects the types of celebration activities you would most like to experience in Centennial Square (select one).





Q3 How would you most like to experience Centennial Square as a place to sit and relax? Choose an image that reflects the types of experience you would most like to have in Centennial Square (select one).





Q4 Choose an image that reflects the type of attraction that could make Centennial Square a unique destination (select one).






Q9 In which neighbourhood do you live?



Q11 What is your age range?





	And, speaking of our wet weather, while grass seating sounds like a great idea, it doesn't seem a very good use of the space, given how wet it will be a good portion of the year. Maybe small patches of grass or strips, would be better. That way it's available for the good weather, but not too much space is wasted during the wetter weather. I love the idea of turning the fountain into a water type feature for kids in good weather! That can easily be adjusted for wet weather since it's paved.		
	I also agree that more cafés, coffee carts, things that will pull the work crowd in all year long would be a great way to make the space feel welcoming.		
	So, I guess in short, this email is just to ask that our weather be taken into consideration in this planning. If it's designed just for the summer months we will fall short of creating a year round, vibrant space.

I reviewed with interest the results of the recent ideas jam on Centennial Square. I liked in particular ideas 1, 3, 5, 7, 8 and 9. I think the various iterations of the urban green concept will prove less successful over time. The notion of a flexible and formally arranged hard surfaced square, near as possible to a level grade, offers the best options for the square long term. However, the critical moves relate to the surrounding uses. At present, there is no real reason to come to the square unless one is going to a government office during the business day, or if there is a specially programmed event. A wide range of other uses that attract people throughout the day are critical for the life of the square. Restaurants, cafes, a library, perhaps a hotel, apartments, shops and other attractions that draw pedestrian traffic throughout the day and night are critical to bring genuine life to the square. Right now it is essentially an institutional space and as a consequence, people have limited reasons to go there. The square itself is ugly but it would work a lot better if there were a wide range of active uses at grade flanking all sides of the square, such as one typically finds in the most successful urban squares in Europe. Finally the parkade has to be replaced with a multi-storey mixed use building in scale with the square, with active uses at grade on all four faces. By all means have parking below grade, including below the square itself, but the above ground space should be used for more humane uses.

The drawings are not good resolution. I cannot read the text in many cases. Would you please post in higher resolution, maybe so they can be clicked on to make larger?

I also find it difficult to understand some terms and determine the perspective. They really need narrative attached. Are they posted in a format accessible to screen readers? If you imbed text descriptions for them, please post for everyone else. There is new terminology such as sticky edges that needs to be explained. Tiara, totemic monoliths, pavilion, undercroft, civic room... It's like this is just for the people who were there.

Does one of the plans involve moving the mosaic columns to the Douglas Street end? That would provide the iconic gateway.

Are you really considering glass houses? Wont' they be vandalized?

How about posting the current layout with parts labeled first? And then follow with plans on same scale and perspective for each "Direction" to aid in comparison? Also, have photos as it is now, of each elevation and perspective. I'm looking at drawings from Douglas perspective trying to remember what is there now.

Grassy areas will become the toilet area for downtown dogs and not be useable by humans. Not a good idea. If you want the feeling of green, then a raised bed of planted shrubs and trees with understory. Dogs will get in there, but people won't be tempted to lounge. Yet is will deaden sound and create the impression of being in a green space.

What are you going to do about the monolithic wall of the parkade? I suggested a green wall or massive sculpture. Rejected?

Parents and supervisors will want places to sit surrounding any water play area. In the third drawing, seating looks to be further away than many parents would be comfortable in. I can't tell what the Greek key structure in the 4th is. Is it seating?

To Engagement and Community Planning Staff,

The Flamenco de la Isla Society holds its Victoria Flamenco Festival each year in Centennial Square and we are excited about the plans to improve the space and bring more vibrancy to the Square.

We especially like the ideas to improve the Square's connections with Douglas Street and the other entrances to the Square and to facilitate temporary installations such as cafe kiosks or food trucks in the Square, with more inviting and shady areas for people to sit, including the stage area.

For festivals and performances, we believe it is important to have a permanent (or retractable) shade/weather canopy over the stage. This would be greatly beneficial to musicians who in summer need a shady spot to play on the stage and it would be essential in cases of rain. We would also like to have a permanent green room behind the stage where one of the outside walls of the room could act as a backdrop to the stage. This could be a place for various groups to hang artwork, scenery, banners or special decors.

During the years of the festival, we have experienced quite strong winds coming into the square in the early afternoon from the west or south west. We have to have weights on all our materials at our information tent and we have additional props that we have to anchor with some difficulty. If possible, some kind of wind deterrent would be helpful.

I am adding a "wish" to the list but this may be outside the purview of the plan. We put down our own wood floor on the stage each year and we have been approached by other dance groups to use our floor in their performances at the Square. The floor is showing signs of wear and it would be great to have a stage surface that would be suitable for dance. Flamenco dance needs a particular surface where the audience can hear the sounds of the feet.

Thank you for your consideration. We love the opportunity to hold our festival in the Square and are thankful for the support of the City of Victoria,

The Ideas Jam

The purpose of the Ideas jam was to generate preliminary design ideas and directions based on the design framework developed in phase 1 and public input and feedback received in the process to date.

Design ideas generated were broadly premised on restoring the original intent of the square as the City's main civic gathering space while supporting its evolution as a venue for appropriately scaled events and festivals, and creating a more fun, inclusive and welcoming space for people of all ages and abilities.

Design directions and ideas included:

- Creating a more simplified and formal civic space with more seamless physical and visual connections
- Flexible and adaptable design to support a diversity of year round activities, events and programming
- Ensuring high quality design and materials and incorporating ample seating and appropriately located shelter for year round comfort
- Incorporating active edges through use and design of buildings to support vitality and eyes on the square throughout the day and year round
- Incorporating elements of play using water, furniture and art to create a more welcoming, fun and adaptable environment for children and families

The preliminary design directions generated at the Ideas Jam (and feedback on them) will be used to develop a refined set of concept options and a draft preferred concept. This in turn will be presented back to the public and stakeholders for further review and input later this fall and in early 2019.
