To City of Victoria Mayor and Council,

We, the members of George Jay Parent Advicory Council, are writing to offer our support for the traffic calming measures

requested by the group Neighbours of Chambers, presenting to Victoria City Council on September 19th, 2019. Traffic calming on Chambers Street and Caledonia Avenue is in the best interest of many businesses, schools, and organizations in the neighbourhood - including ours - that operate in the interest of children and families.

We support the group Neighbours of Chambers in their petition to City of Victoria Council on September 19th, to undertake traffic calming on Chambers/Caledonia as a priority this coming year, with the following specific measures:

1. That immediate steps be taken to reduce speeds along Chambers St.

2. That a process be established to co-create a comprehensive plan for traffic flow through the Chambers/Caledonia/Pembroke corridor that takes into account the impacts of proposed developments, including those at Wellburn's (Cook/Pandora), the North Park Teacherage property (Chambers/North Park) and the Vic High Lands (Chambers, Gladstone, Grant, Caledonia), as well as the existing and proposed Pandora Avenue bike lanes and Vancouver Street bike & pedestrian way, respectively.

3. That Funds be allocated in the 2020 Budget for this initiative.
