Hello COV, I am opposed to the amendment bylaw regarding the extension of swim docks, wharves, piers in Gorge Waterway Park.

My primary objection, is the inadequate infrastructure. I live at 1240 Styles, at the corner of Selkirk and I am in a good position to evaluate/observe park activities.

The bylaw amendment does not indicate any public restrooms, change rooms, or additional parking will be provided within the proposed bylaw amendment. Currently, many park users are using the nearby bushes for waste disposal and urination. Parking is inadequate and often quickly used up by trucks pulling a trailer full of kayaks or sup boards for both childrens' summer camps and various retailers (eg Palli Palli) attending to customers. The COV sidewalk and crosswalk upgrade at the corner of Selkirk and Styles will actually remove one parking spot since a bicycle ramp is to be added to the existing sidewalk where there is currently a parking spot.

The map which accompanied my letter, is the same map posted at the site. This map does not show existing docks, and does not show proposed docks or any changes whatsoever. Perhaps that was a mistake by COV to provide a map with no details relevant to the bylaw amendment. I will oppose this development until a study is undertaken by COV to determine infrastructure requirements such as public safety, public sanitation, vehicular accommodation, taxpayer expense and neighborhood impact. When that information is made available, I would gladly reconsider.
