Staff Review and Public Comment

Staff Review:

- 726 Johnson Street
- Staff recommend patio hours are reduced to mitigate impacts.

Public Comment:

- Letters were sent to 846 owners and occupants
- Five letters were received in response where four letters expressed concern regarding the liquor primary establishment, and one was supportive of the application and was from the Downtown Residents Association



Recommendation

That Council direct staff to notify the Liquor and Cannabis Regulation Branch that Council supports the recommended hours of 9 am to 2 am daily for interior space and 9am to 11:30pm daily for the exterior patio, with an occupant load of 140 people including a 17 person patio for The Vicious Poodle located at 726 Johnson Street for a new liquor primary licence.
