

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Staff Review and Public Comment

Staff Review:

Recommendation

That Council direct staff to notify the Liquor and Cannabis Regulation Branch that Council supports the application of Phillips Brewing Company located at 2010 Government Street for an outdoor patio service area connected with their existing manufacturer's lounge endorsement service area having hours from 11am to 11pm daily, where the existing occupant load (134 people) associated with the indoor service area would be shared with the proposed patio service area.
