E.2 <u>1114 and 1116 McClure Street: Rezoning Application No. 00772 for an Associated Development Permit with Variances (Fairfield)</u>

 - a. ensure that a future strata cannot restrict long-term rental to non-owners
 - b. provision of four two-bedroom units and two three-bedroom units
 - c. provision of the following Transportation Demand Management measures:
 - a car share membership and \$100 usage credit for each dwelling unit
 - ii. electric charging for bicycles
 - iii. bicycle repair station.
