I would rather unravel everything, including all of the pre-conceived (colonial) notions of public space as a first step, instead of simply overlaying information received from different cultures onto the same conception of a streetscape - i.e. there is so much more potential than just adding art, event, vendor and cultural programming spaces. Government Street needs different perspectives and values to shape this public space as a place that is relevant for the present and future for the people who live here as well as for tourists. So what does that mean? A discussion that starts with what this public space is should begin to unwind the go-to design solutions and make us all go deeper. For example, as the design is based on the shared space approach what does that mean in terms of reciprocity, social connection and other values and perspectives? How could that open up new ways of designing the street? Also, instead of the "Old Town Victoria" light fixtures, I would 100% prefer to see contemporary design that is 'of our time' as an overlay onto the heritage architecture. We definitely need to invest in accent lighting to not only light but also animate the public realm experience during our dark winter days. We are revitalizing an important street for current and future generations so it is therefore vitally important for Government Street to connect with our times, rather than expressing only one particular period of (colonial) time in the past. Even the tourists will become bored with this, it has already become trite and will relevancy. High quality stone paving would be a great material to connect the old architecture with the new public space. Walking on the granite pavers of Bloor Street in Toronto, you just feel better and know that this is a significant street. First, the centreline dividers proposed for Government Street could include trees intended to replace the trees now in the sidewalks, some of which, when they reach their end of life, may be removed and not replaced. This would have the effect of reducing barriers to mobility on the sidewalks during times when vehicular traffic is allowed, while still maintaining that beautiful green canopy. Second, at present, the corner of Humboldt/Government/Wharf discriminates against traffic approaching on Humboldt. The light for Humboldt traffic is too short, allowing only one or two cars to pass. And during peak times, traffic turning left off of Government and on to Wharf leaves no room for Humboldt traffic to move through the light even if it is green for them. Part of the problem is the traffic light at the bottom of Fort, which causes traffic to backup. Perhaps the Fort/Wharf light can be timed with the lights at Government/Wharf/Humboldt in such a way as to ensure that traffic flowing off of Government and on to Wharf will continue to flow past Fort unimpeded. I assume that the timed vehicular access to Government Street through Old Town will be during peak traffic hours. Third, I am okay with small retail sidewalk booths, but not if they are to be used as expanded sales vehicles for existing brick-and-mortar businesses. Let these booths be limited for use by small independent merchant/manufacturers producing local products. Forth, public toilets would be appreciated, at least every three to four blocks.












































Q5 What is your overall level of support for what is proposed for Government Street between Courtney and Yates?

I find it very unpleasant to sit or stand in these places for very long since I am nearly always confronted with second-hand smoke. While cycling up and down the All Ages & Abilities bike lane on Fort St I am frequently having to inhale second-hand cigarette/pot smoke from people standing on the edge of the sidewalk curb (right beside me!), having a smoke. Please, somehow, figure out how to make this a 100% smoke-free zone. (Or provide an enclosed air-tight cubicle for all the smokers to smoke in....) It is ironic that I am frequently cycling or walking, helping reduce air pollution, but having to inhale others' second-hand smoke. Can every space be categorized as 7 m or less from a door or can the entire street be zoned as "park" so that all forms of smoking can be banned? So few of us smoke but it appears to be increasingly harder to avoid breathing in second-hand smoke and have access to clean air. (2) Pedestrians also need to be reminded to look out for cyclists. Frequently, pedestrians walk straight in front of me when I am cycling up or down the Fort St All Ages and Abilities bike lanes...the pedestrians are not obeying the traffic lights (they are crossing when the light is red for them but green for me as a cyclist. I have almost cycled straight into a pedestrian multiple times and it has not been my fault; many of them have apologized to me profusely afterwards, for not looking before walking straight in front of me (while knowingly disobeying the traffic signal.)

In addition to the Christmas Parade, Halloween and other family festivities, is it possible to have the May Day Parade march down Government Street to begin the summer season? 2. Restaurant patios have expanded significantly in Bastion Square, eliminating stall spaces for the long running Bastion Square Market. Is it possible to create an area for street markets, such as the sidewalk along the 1200 block federal government building? That stretch is not particularly interesting for pedestrians. 3. To reach the harbour from Chinatown, bicyclists riding down Government must turn right at Yates, then left at Wharf. Confusing, awkward and dangerous. Is it possible for bicyclists to ride down Government from Yates to the harbour? That would make cycling much more friendly. 4. The avenue of hornbeams is a major element on the streetscape. Some people love them, some people hate them. Some say remove all trees to reveal the beauty of the building facades. Be careful what you wish for. Before making a rash decision, that issue should be thoroughly investigated. (I am also a retired Professional Forester.) 5. Pan handling and related activities have been an increasing problem for the downtown business community. Despite considerable expense including hiring security guards, installing security cameras and alarm systems and building gates in deter negative activities, problems persist and seem to be getting worst. Ask Geoff Young and Alan Lowe, both former tenants who had their offices broken into. Is it possible to red zone Government Street to reduce such activities? 6. Lighting is such a major element of design. Make it beautiful and safe at night. Also can building facades be high lighted, especially for the Christmas Season. Retain a good lighting designer for this task. And please do not use blue Christmas lights as in the recent past. A blustery wintery evening along Government Street is already cold


































Q8 What is your overall level of support for what is proposed for Government Street between Yates and Pandora?

Concern about moveable furnishings like signs and chairs on sidewalks. Public Realm Design Guidelines contains barriers - low contrast furnishings. Information does not follow Universal Design Principle 4. Streets are not labeled, distances not given, and the Mobility schematics are challenging to grasp. Most information is graphic. Where do mobility scooters park? Where is the adjacent accessible parking and is it all parallel, or any van accessible with access aisles? Letting mobility forms that not everyone can enjoy during car closures is discriminatory (pedicabs & carriages). Can't get a wheelchair on a horse drawn carriage, and many people could not climb up. Who will frequent more restaurants and bars, other than seasonal tourists and the moneyed crowd in this city. (There is plenty of wealth in Victoria that NEVER reaches the street here.) Will restaurants and bars will they expect the city to compensate? or lessen city taxation amounts? better be VERY clear with policy before enacting, and as a taxpayer, I will not support. Don't forget current and growing inflation and food scarcity due to factors the city cannot control.....will rest/bars become the purview of the wealthy only? (we have TONS of money in this city that NEVER reaches the street) I for one, have definitely stopped going out to bars and restaurants as I used to, upon seeing the increased prices. From now on, I am only considering places that I feel have quality offerings & service - which is about 50% in Victoria. When I cycled on Barcelona streets in 2017, I was on narrow streets amongst pedestrians. I have enough respect and sense to travel at their pace, walk the bike when necessary, and not impose myself. Which Victoria neighbourhood do you live in?





It brings me to a Register page, even though I was already signed in.

Anyway, the substance:

Firstly, about low allergen plantings. I I attended an online forum and brought up the topic of low allergen planting. Someone responded that the City will follow its standard in this regard. I felt that staff considered that this issue was "in hand" and dismissed it. I don't think it is addressed and thus I raise it again.

I follow this topic and am not aware of a City standard.

The City established CITY OF VICTORIA PARKS Lower Allergen Landscape Planting Resource List for its use. The document consists of some considerations and information on plant allergen ratings. It is not a standard.

"This plant list is intended to assist in the selection of lower allergen landscape plantings and is not a comprehensive list. For additional resources please refer to the document Pollinator and Allergy-Friendly Gardening in the City of Victoria. Below are some tips to help increase the success of your lower allergen planting."

"Consider proximity of plantings to high traffic or gathering areas to reduce the potential for plant species that can attract unwanted pests i.e. social wasps such as yellow jackets"

Build Back Victoria Permit Requirements & Information says only "Where planters may be installed as part of the patio, businesses may consult the City's Low Allergen Landscape Planting Resource List."

So that is entirely voluntary and I am not aware of any processes in place to ensure that businesses follow low allergen planting practices.

This consideration may have been sufficient for a hastily cobbled together program to help businesses survive during the pandemic but is not sufficient going forward. Instead, under the Government Street plan, private businesses who want to use the public domain should be *required* to use lower allergen plants. They are being given a privilege and it is reasonable to ensure that they help make everyone welcome.

Staff have advised Council that they use low allergen plantings where people travel and congregate, but this is not always the case. Given the pedestrian priority objective of this project, it would seem to be incumbent to recognize this as a place where people congregate and plant accordingly. It's also not just about pollen, but also attracting stinging insects. Not to do so would be creating a barrier, which is contrary to the Accessibility Framework.

Secondly, I would hope that staff would seriously consider previous input about dogs. Dogs can be anywhere in the City on leash, but being on leash does not preclude those dogs creating barriers for people. It may be fair to expect that as downtown gets denser and traffic is reduced, dogs will become a major user of Government Street. Some of the "room-type" seating areas may prove suitable for dog-free refuges. I request that you incorporate dog bag dispensers and anti-odor dog waste receptacles. I also share with you Principles for Accessibility in the Fairfield Neighbourhood Plan, 2019, which explains and substantiates the need for the things I am asking for.

As part of this plan process, a Health, Wellness, and Accessibility workshop was held. The following principles and strategies were suggested for design of public realm in Cook Street Village:

- Make it comfortable to navigate to and in the village for differently-abled users, considering factors such as lighting, pavement selection, signage, comfort in accessing transit, accessible parking and loading, and accommodation/ parking for a range of mobility devices.
- Enhance safety and comfort within the village, considering factors such as pavement texture and pattern selection, enhanced crossings, allergens (e.g. in landscape, from dogs), and creating a welcoming ambiance in all seasons (e.g. selection of landscape for colour and interest; furnishings, lighting)
- Encourage gathering of people of all ages and abilities. In designing public realm and "outdoor rooms", consider a range of specific needs. While all spaces should be physically accessible, a full range of different abilities

should be considered so that there is a space for everyone. (Examples: allergen-free area; location on a side street for those needing quieter environment; safe child-friendly spaces.

Thirdly, I believe that my verbal comment about **lighting** was not understood. The AWG made recommendations about lighting for people with brain injuries and differences. From what little I know, it's about flicker rates. My comment was not about the light standards, but the bulbs. I believe that Councillor Loveday is knowledgeable about these lighting standards.

Hi, I realized I hadn't finished the survey and tried to fill it all out by midnight, but got timed out. Just thought I might as well send along some of what I'd written already:

I support each of these 4 segment visions, and the overall vision, but it would have still been welcome to have a bit more information on how these Government St. plans fit into the overall area. I know that Govt. is the street that needs to undergo construction anyway, and the refresh at the same time makes complete sense. But at the same time there are already pedestrian-priority but underdesigned / under-programmed nearby streets (eg Broad) and squares, whose future I would have also liked to hear more about.

How will the Broad corridor, Govt. corridor, Wharf corridor, and cut-through corridors (between Govt & wharf) interact with each other? Imo a cut-through in the middle of lower Yates (corresponding to the ones by the parkade on street down and market square one street up) could benefit pedestrian movement (and alleviate foot-traffic congestion) just as much as extending Government sidewalks on that block.

Similarly, I'm very pleased to see the Chinese community highlighted in the proposed plaza but would have liked to see the existing Centennial given more programming and emphasis more so than a new adjacent area. I also wonder if such valuable public land could be better used for things like housing or a small community centre / library type building. It's weirdly shaped, so I'd be totally willing to accept that those uses are much less viable than a square. The point is just that the wondering happens--I would have just liked to see the materials engage with these alternatives a bit more, and with the other nearby pedestrian areas and their (under)use a bit more. And my apologies of course if this kind of thing is addressed in materials I haven't seen.

Thanks for all your work, and I hope my thoughts as a frequent pedestrian through these blocks can be of some small help. Looking forward to strolling along the finished product in a few years!

Ladies and Gentlemen:

One of the issues that appears to be a constant when this type of project is being considered, finalized and ultimately put to the (*often expensive*) is the one of "unintended consequences". Said consequences seem to be on the verge of coming to the fore once again in the City.

Too often, what begins as a great idea or concept becomes something akin to addictive to those who promote it, to the point where anyone who does speak words of caution about the "side effects" of Project Z tends to be overlooked or as has happened, outright ignored. Then, when those very real consequences happen (and they do), Project Z becomes something of a fait accompli, and those in charge are quick to point out that "while we had money to spend on Project Z, sadly there isn't enough money set aside to alleviate the specific issues we overlooked early in the process.." The recent issue of traffic diversion on Richardson Street, where one of only a few access points to Oak Bay was cut off over the protests of residents, commuters and even the Oak Bay Mayor and Council proceeded apace with little or no credence paid to those who raised their hands to speak. is only one example. The list of projects that might fall under the umbrella of "unintended" or perhaps more properly "overlooked" consequences could include the partial closure of Beacon Hill Park, which initially cut off access to a good percentage of the handicapped folks. Also, the basic concept of bike lanes on both sides of Pandora, which resulted in traffic lanes with zero margin for larger vehicles -legally permitted to be 102 in (2.5m)- such as buses and larger delivery trucks on the main route from the eastern portions of the City to the West (via the Johnson St Bridge). Reports from those who must use this corridor daily (Transit operators, delivery folks) still talk about being forced to proceed down Pandora with their outside mirrors overhanging one

lane or the other and that it's only a matter of time before something "really bad" happens.

Unintended Consequences- Even though I do not reside within the City Limits, I can still see what is bound to happen if access Government Street north from Humboldt is cut off, and I can only wonder why no City official has come forward with options for the vehicles (*large and small*) that will not be permitted.

If a commuter's destination is Saanich or beyond, there are truly 5 ways out of James Bay to the north - Wharf, Government, Douglas, Blanshard and finally, Quadra. Vancouver Street, which like Blanshard and Quadra is easily accessed via Superior Street, has been largely closed to commuter traffic, is no longer part of the overall picture. This closure has already added to the traffic volume on Quadra and Blanshard streets. Closing off Government Street would exacerbate what is already a nearly-untenable situation.

So where will these folks go? Obviously, the answer is "to one of the remaining streets- Douglas, Wharf Blanshard or Quadra. Has anyone determined how the addition of the Government Street traffic will affect those already-crowded streets? Blanshard northbound at times resembles a parking lot already. Blanshard also funnels northbound traffic to the Pat Bay Highway, as does Quadra, while Wharf Street is really just a funnel to the Vic West area, though many hundreds of commuters utilize it to get to Selkirk and beyond. Additionally, Douglas Street must be at or very close to capacity, while Cook Street is likely too distant and too hard to access (*via either South Turner or Dallas*) to be included in the conversation.

In the end, Government Street is really one of only two arteries which ultimately lead to the West Shore, one of the fastest-growing areas of the CRD. Diverting access to the sole remaining street will inevitably result in more and more vehicles (*large and small*) standing still, stuck in heavier traffic, wasting fuel, and perhaps more importantly, time as a result of the changes being considered today.

Please give serious thought to what will happen to all those cars and how their redeployment to essentially the sole remaining arterial street will affect its' loading before you make this decision. At the same time, please check for the possibility of

there being more "unintended" or "accidentally overlooked" consequences to this proposal should it go through?

I recently read an article in the Times Colonist Extra about the plan for Government Street. I run a technology business in Bastion Square. Overall, I love the ideas presented for the future of Government Street. Anything that makes our neighbourhood more vibrant and friendly is okay by me.

That said, if we're going to be inviting even more performers to Bastion Square, I'd ask that the city seriously consider how it will start to enforce it's bylaw around street performers and noise. We've noticed that street performers at the entrance to Bastion Square routinely use amplification despite the bylaws laid out here:

When performers use amplification, it echoes through the square and impacts our ability to use our office effectively. Some street performers start at three or four in the afternoon and amplify themselves loudly enough that it makes it difficult to hold a Zoom call or concentrate on a document. At the moment, we grin and bear it. If the plan is to encourage more performances, it's important that the city proactively educates street performers on its noise bylaws and enforces the bylaws when they're broken.



We have been in existence since 1974. Unfortunately we are no longer located in Chinatown (since 2017) but have presence for performances in Chinatown every so often.

We love the idea, and feel greatly honored to be able to participate and provide feedback towards this project.

I love the ideas that Ammar had thought of, such as kung fu workshops or public performances. I had a similar vision when I first heard of this project, as well as some additional ideas. I will list some ideas below. Please let me know if you have any questions or require any additional information.

A large open concept area or a staged 20-25ft x 20-25 ft with a 15 + feet covered area from the elements, like Centennial square. Which could host public Cultural performances/ workshops for Kung Fu/Lion dance periodically as well as other local Chinese and many other cultural groups to promote and maintain their traditions throughout the year. A large covered area for audience seating under the elements, which could also be used for audience participation in workshops/programs/presentations/pop up night markets/events.

Tabes for mahjong, Chinese checkers, calligraphy lessons or such.

A well lit overhead lighting with LED's that can change colours of the LED's for special occasions or seasons ie Christmas.

Lit up lantern. Same lamp posts as in Chinatown around the perimeter of the area as mentioned in the concept. Same bike racks & garbage cans as in Chinatown.

Love the idea of a bench that could be a place to play, picnic, sit and lounge, as mentioned in the concept.

Signage that directs you to the Chinatown Gate, and Chinese Canadian Museum - Victoria location (if and when they find a permanent location).

Signage that briefly names and explains the different Chinese Associations in Chinatown, such as Chinese Consolidated Benevolent Association (CCBA), Shon Yee Benevolent Association... Wong Sheung Kung Fu Club's presence in Chinatown for over 40 years.. etc... just to name a few.

A four sided, thick glass off box showcasing a Chinese Lion dance costume and a Dragon costume with signage explaining the differences, which could also allow the public to take photos with.

A Chinese style garden with peonies or peony sculpture artwork.

Some built-in activities for kids/adults, such as a board or signage on how to say some simple Cantonese and Mandarin words.



Hi there,

I've already completed the survey but had another thought after walking the closed section of Government street again on the weekend. It is a suggestion to find a way of making the pedestrian signals at the cross streets with Government more visible from the middle of the road, they are hard to see if you stay in the road to cross as they are mostly only visible straight ahead in-line with the sidewalk and if you are heading south there are no traffic lights to tell you that the lights are not in your favour either if you stay in the road way to cross and continue walking south in the middle of government street.

So to enable using the roadway to walk along, perhaps the pedestrian signals could be flipped from the outside to the inside of the poles or a signal added in the old roadway to support pedestrians wanting to walk in the roadway and stay there when traversing the cross streets.

Also I'm still finding that the cones are being pushed aside or are not out well after 1pm at the cross streets with Government so cars are still entering the street despite the signage indicating they should not. Perhaps the city could install parking garage gates on timers at the cross streets that could close and be backed up with cones underneath and plenty of space for pedestrians to get past the gates.

Good morning. I am responding to your invitation to comment on the proposed changes to Government Street.

I have scaled the diagrams on your website and used Google Earth to determine the following:

- The current width of the vehicular portion of Government at Humboldt and immediately north of there (Lekwungen cultural plaza) is approximately 7 m. and allows vehicular movement in both directions.
- 2. Your plans show the proposed vehicular portion being reduced to 5 m. or slightly less. That is not mentioned in the text for this section of Government.
- 3. The National Association of City Transportation Officials' "Urban Street Design Guide" states "Lane width should be considered within the overall assemblage of the street. Travel lane widths of 10 feet generally provide adequate safety in urban settings while discouraging speeding. Cities may choose to use 11-foot lanes on designated truck and bus routes (one 11-foot lane per direction) or adjacent to lanes in the opposing direction. For your information, 10 feet equals 3 m. and 11 feet equals 3.35 m.
- 4. The proposed width of 5 m. or less for the vehicular portion of this section of Government...and elsewhere...is not sufficient to allow vehicular movement in both directions.
- 5. A width of 5 m. will only allow vehicular movement in one direction....effectively making Government Street a one-way street.
- 6. A width of this magnitude will not be sufficient to allow commercial vehicles to stop and unload **and** to allow other commercial vehicles to move around stopped vehicles to their particular destinations on Government Street. Pullouts/loading zones will be necessary but I do not think the proposed changes provide for that.
- 7. A very good example of the effect of this type of constriction is on Memorial Crescent. A sidewalk was extended along the east side of the street adjacent to the cemetery where no sidewalk previously existed. This has reduced the width of the vehicular portion of the street to the point where the City installed a "Yield To Oncoming Traffic" sign and portable concrete bases to protect a stretch of parked cars. As well, some drivers are reluctant to even drive on any portion of that street if there is any oncoming traffic and other drivers drive down the middle, leading to confusion by oncoming drivers and the honking of car horns.
- 8. Another example is the section of Richardson Street from Cook Street to Moss Street. That section is no longer 2-way and causes challenges for two oncoming cars if there is not a vacant parking spot to pull into so one car may then pass the other.

I don't have any further comments as I think the City will do whatever our Mayor and Councillors want to do. They have made that abundantly clear in the past. I just hope that any potential negative impacts of

whatever is proposed are not just brushed off and that genuine effort and consideration is expended to mitigate those impacts.

Firstly, we don't have the population to support the plan. We are not European minded, no matter how much we'd like to be, with a culture that has an imbedded experience of hundreds of years of piazzas. Nor do we enjoy a year round agreeable climate.

I lived in Vancouver and same thing happened to the once vibrant section of downtown Granville. Where once were cafes & boutiques south of Georgia became peep shows and cheap convenience stores with marauding groups of vagrants. North of Georgia, with all the high end department stores that once had their best display windows facing Granville were filled with seasonal fashion excitement with hundreds of shoppers, traffic and taxi cabs, also became a dead zone of concrete as quiet as an early Sunday morning.

Auto traffic brings people - they come and go, get dropped off and cruise the sights.

I've spoken to business owners who have complained about how customers have dropped off since closing roads, despite Covid and sadly many have moved out or planning to. Myself, and everyone I know, rarely go downtown anymore. When I moved here from Vancouver, downtown Victoria was fun and charming. Now it's become ugly, and the road closures only seem to highlight this.



- It should look more like an open causeway than a street. (No curbs/minimal painted lines). Use different coloured bricks or other less obvious methods to define approved vehicular traffic routes.
- use durable patio stones/bricks rather than pavement or asphalt.
- provide electrically operated bollards at key intersections that can be actuated during certain times of the day by delivery vehicles, emergency responders etc. The bollards would retract into the ground when open.



Dear City of Victoria,

I applaud your willingness to re-envision Government Street, which is an iconic part of downtown Victoria, and an area that is ripe for creating a more accessible, livable, low-carbon community.

I also applaud the city for its willingness to undertake a robust series of engagements on the future of Government Street.

My thoughts on the matter are as follows.

- 1. Government Street, from Humboldt Street to Yates Street, should be permanently closed to traffic. Given the close proximity of Wharf Street, lower Government Street is not necessary as an automobile thoroughfare, and vehicles can easily circumvent this stretch of road, en route to Vic West or the northern reaches of downtown.
- 2. By closing lower Government Street to traffic, the space would be reclaimed by pedestrians, cyclists, and street culture. I have had the privilege of spending time in both European and Latin American plazas, and Government Street could become a place that is vibrant with street life.
- 3. The temporary closures to Government Street that occurred during the pandemic demonstrated that the concept is feasible. After the closure of Government Street, I spent more time downtown than I have in the past. Why? Because the street culture attracted me to the area. I also spent time with my kids on Government Street, and as I have said many times before, Victoria lacks cultural assets and amenities that are family-friendly.
- 4. Make lower Government Street a permanent patio space for restaurants, shoppers, and food trucks. I would also add an outdoor stage for music, near the intersection of View and Government. I think the entire street should be lined with food trucks, similar to the food truck zones that have sprouted up all over Portland in recent years. Food trucks are an excellent addition to street culture and provide travellers and locals with access to relatively inexpensive and diverse cuisines.
- 5. Pedestrians and cyclists spend more money than drivers. Study after study has proven this point. The businesses on lower Government Street might be skeptical, but these are the facts. The cars and trucks that transit *through* Government Street by and large do not *stop* on Government Street and spend money. They are simply passing through. This recent report from London found that cyclists and pedestrians spend 40% more than drivers around pedestrian shopping areas. (https://content.tfl.gov.uk/walking-cycling-economic-benefits-summary-pack.pdf.) Many other reports tell a similar story. Pedestrian zones are *good for business.* In any case, drivers can park a block away and make their way over to Government Street with ease.

6. Access to lower Government Street can and should be maintained for delivery trucks. I have included a photograph of retractable bollards, which exist in many European plazas. The idea here is that there would be bollards at the intersection of Humboldt Street and Government Street, which would be retractable via a key code, which would be given to all the businesses on the street, and thus shareable with delivery drivers. The speed limit would be 5 k/h on Government Street, and thus all the business-related deliveries would continue as before, with considerations made for the spacing of food trucks and patios.

Thank you for considering this feedback. I'm delighted at the prospects of creating (mostly) car-free zone in downtown, to be enjoyed by travellers, local residents, and families for generations to come.

Notwithstanding Lisa Helps' inspiration from her European adventure, I suppose this was inevitable. Not that overall it is a bad idea, in fact the concepts may be applied in whole or in part over the wasteland that passes for downtown Victoria.

As a piece of urban planning, at least it supplies a place to start. A principle of such planning that involves public space in the form of plazas, squares, wide corridors, etc., is that of 'constriction and release'. From the constriction of narrow passages, streets, buildings, to the relaxing release of openness that includes relevant structures, landscaping textures and trees, etc.

In relation to what I have seen, read, and observed may I make the following points:

- * I suppose due to the inevitable virtue signalling of this Council and others, having a Lekwungen Plaza is to be expected. At least let it not be littered with ersatz art and artifacts that do not reflect any relationship to what is accurate.
- * Noting the state of Bastion Square, which has had its function as a public square ruined, there is not a need for either semi-frequent performance nor schlocky displays that pass for "Craft Markets".
 - * Cost? There has been a lot of silence in this department.
- * Noting the nature of our climate all seating areas should have some shelter from the elements involved, otherwise there will be a lot of continually empty wet spaces that do nothing to enliven any streetscape.
