 - Enabled by improved recreational access


Goals:

Collaborative Process

- January August 2019
- 3 fact finding & brainstorming meetings
- Many working-committee meetings
- 21 potential sites resulted in:
 - 5 + 2 recommended sites for improved access
 - 4 in Victoria
 - 2 in Esquimalt
 - 1 in Saanich

1. Banfield Park (Forage Fish Beach)

Vision: A beach with all ages and abilities access that also provides habitat for forage fish.

2. Banfield Park Dock (expansion)


Vision: Larger dock to deal with overcrowding.



2. Banfield Park Dock (expansion)

- LARGER (X3)

- Stairs with railing
- Ramp into water
- Bike lock up
- Kayak friendly
- Safety signage
- Interpretive signage
- Stewardship signage



3. Burleith Park

Vision: naturalized setting that provides an access point for viewing flora and fauna.

- General clean up
- Naturalized bird watching area
- Provide access to shoreline
- Stewardship signage



4. Esquimalt Gorge Park

Vision: Enhancement of the excellent naturalized stream and beach areas.



- Additional planting in riparian area of creek
- Reconstruct beach to support forage fish
- Stewardship signage
- Ramp & dock for kayakers

5. Saanich Gorge Park (Curtis Point)

Vision: Minimal changes; easier water access; preserve the existing natural ecosystems.




- Minimal change to this natural setting
- Find solution to soil erosion around Gary Oak meadow
- Install set of stairs or ramp to provide more accessible entry into water
- Install bike racks
- Stewardship signage

6. Arbutus Park


Vision: Create a forage fish / paddle beach at the foot of Washington Street.

- Create forage fish beach
- Remove debris
- Improve access to water
- Install bike racks
- Install park benches
- Stewardship signage



7. Arm Street Park

Vision: enhance the experience at Arm Street Park by adding a ramp and dock
