D.1 Victoria Police Department - Budget

- Privacy legislation around releasing body camera footage
- staffing crisis and immediate need for officers
- Police budget growing in-line with the City of Victoria's budget
- Having a regional approach with E-Comm
- Cost per-capita being the highest in the province due to a relatively small police force
