F.7 612 Constance Avenue (Township of Esquimalt) – Statutory Right of Way Agreement Acquisition

Committee received a report dated May 5, 2023 from the Director of Engineering and Public Works regarding approval of a Statutory Right of Way agreement for a City of Victoria water meter vault, at 612 Constance Avenue, within the Township of Esquimalt.

- 1. That Council authorize that the City of Victoria enter into a Statutory Right of Way agreement for the lands at 612 Constance in the Township of Esquimalt (the "Agreement") on the terms satisfactory to the Director of Engineering and Public Works, and in the form satisfactory to the City Solicitor, for an area of approximately 16.0m2 (4.0m * 4.0m) at 612 Constance Avenue, Esquimalt for the purpose of the City's installation, maintenance and operation of a water meter and associated vault on the lands legally described as Lot A, Suburban Lots 44 and 45, Esquimalt District, Plan EPP86051 (PID 031-206-379).
- 2. That no legal right or obligation will be created and none shall arise until the Agreement is fully executed by the City.
- 3. That Council direct staff to add to the delegation authority that Statutory Right of Way considerations for services determined necessary for a development (sanitary, water or storm drainage) be delegated to the Director of Engineering and Public Works to consider and enter into Statutory Right of Way agreements in a form satisfactory to the City Solicitor.

E. LAND USE MATTERS

E.1 340-346 Mary Street and 247-253 Russell Street: Rezoning Application No. 00832 (Vic West)

Committee received a report dated April 6 2023, from the Director of Sustainable Planning and Community Development, with the purpose to present Council with information, analysis and recommendations for a Rezoning Application for the property located at 340-346 Mary Street and 247-253 Russell Street.

Committee discussed the following:

- The on-site products and restrictions surrounding them
- The potential of manufacturing a cannabis industry
- Projected population density in the area

- 1. That Council instruct the Director of Sustainable Planning and Community Development to prepare the necessary Zoning Regulation Bylaw amendment that would authorize the proposed development outlined in the staff report March 8, 2023 for 340-346 Mary Street and 247-253 Russell Street.
- 2. That first and second reading of the zoning bylaw amendment be considered by Council and a public hearing date be set once the following conditions are met:
 - a. Revised plans detailing the required frontage works and driveway crossings in compliance with the requirements of the Highway Access Bylaw which include works as they relate to the new multi-use trail crossing of Mary Street.
- 3. That subject to approval in principle at the public hearing, the applicant prepare and execute the following legal agreements, with contents satisfactory to the Director of Engineering and Public Works and form satisfactory to the City Solicitor prior to adoption of the bylaw:
 - a. Design and provide security for the installation of full frontage works to current City of Victoria standards including full height curb, sidewalk (1.8m), boulevard and potential tree, and which are compatible with recent E&N Trail construction and the new multi-use trail crossing of Mary Street including a new crosswalk and cross ride as a condition of rezoning to be completed within 180 days of adoption of the Zoning Bylaw.
- 4. That adoption of the zoning bylaw amendment will not take place until all of the required legal agreements that are registrable in the Land Title Office have been so registered to the satisfaction of the City Solicitor.
- 5. That the above recommendations be adopted on the condition that they create no legal rights for the applicant or any other person, or obligation on the part of the City or its officials, and any expenditure of funds is at the risk of the person making the expenditure.

F.4 <u>Downtown Revitalization Program (Verbal)</u>

- Potential of retractable bollards
- Horse carriages and kabuki cabs being permitted in car free zones
- Inaccessibility of parades on Government Street
- Behaviour changes and plans to help make road rules clear on Government Street for pedestrians and cyclists
- Public art opportunities to celebrate Lekwungen culture

F.6 Municipal Licencing of Passenger Directed Vehicles

Committee received a report dated May 12, 2023 from the City Clerk regarding lessons learned since the implementation of the Province's licencing

requirements, including the introduction of ride-hailing, and to seek Council direction on updating the City's regulatory framework for Passenger Directed Vehicles.

Committee discussed the following:

- The differentiations between pedicabs and passenger directed vehicle licencing
- The possibility of price regulations on high demand ride hailing times
- Data tracking in relation to transportation and it's effect on the City's transportation goals
- Appeal processes with ride share programs

Moved By Councillor Dell Seconded By Councillor Hammond

- 1. That Council direct staff to: Set a corporate rate for Passenger Directed Vehicles of \$140 for each operator up to a maximum amount depending on the number of operators in the Business Licence Bylaw.
- 2. Require a copy of each Passenger Directed Vehicle company's provincial authorization to operate and a copy of each operator's provincial Record Check Certificate when a business licence application is made.
- 3. Set a rate of \$30 for zero emissions vehicles and \$0 for wheelchair accessible vehicles in the Business Licence Bylaw tied to the proposed corporate fee structure.
- 4. Require monthly data sharing on the total number pick-ups and drop-offs occurring and the vehicle type in the Business Licence Bylaw.
- 5. Conduct a public notice process pursuant to section 59(2) of the Community Charter outlining a method for those who consider they are affected by the Business Licence Bylaw to make written submissions to Council.
- 6. Reduce existing duplication in the Vehicles for Hire Bylaw with provincial requirements.
- Allow Passenger Directed Vehicles to drop off or pick up passengers in metered parking spaces for up to two minutes in the Streets and Traffic Bylaw.
- 8. Report back to Council if additional regulatory changes need to be made.
 8a. Staff report back to Council when a ride-hailing operator's total number of licenses approaches 200 or more licenses, so Council may revisit the expansion of the fee structure.
- 9. That this be brought forward to the daytime Council of May 18, 2023 for approval.
