







## **Legislative Authority**

5

Sections 617 and 618 of the Local Government Act,

Council may issue a Heritage Alteration Permit which may be subject to terms consistent with the purpose of the heritage protection of the property, including:

- (i) conditions respecting the sequencing and timing of construction,
- (ii) conditions respecting the character of the alteration or action to be authorized, including landscaping and the siting, form, exterior design and finish of buildings and structures and security.
- (iii) Council may refuse to issue a Heritage Alteration Permit for an action that, in the opinion of Council, would not be consistent with the purpose of the heritage protection of the property.




