- Through education, research, and stewardship, we encourage CoV residents to grow their own food, improve their organic waste management, and support their community.


CEC's Demonstration Site


- Located at 1216 North Park St, open to the public for all to enjoy.

- Receives 1,500+ visitors every year.














Fernwood Community Association Transition (\$12,139)

Transfer of unspent grant funds from FCA's "Volunteer Coordinator Grant" and "Community Garden Design Grant"

- 2 gardens maintained
- 1 garden designed
- 69 gardeners supported

Volunteer coordination to maintain a boulevard garden network in Fairfield-Gonzales and a fruit tree orchard in Alexander Park


- 91 volunteers engaged

Summary of Benefits

Alignment of CEC Activities with City of Victoria Guiding Policy Documents

2023-2026 Strategic Plan	Accelerate the reduction of emissions from transportation and waste. Create more public gathering spaces with experiential features. Expand supports for urban agriculture, gardening, and food security and food sovereignty initiatives.
Zero Waste Four-Year Action Plan	Increase diversion from multifamily dwellings from 51% to 72%. Divert yard waste an additional 2 percentage points from curbside garbage stream to organics. Support diversion of avoidable and unavoidable food waste volume produced by small businesses. Develop and disseminate Zero Waste event guidelines.
