Dear Councillor,

I am sending this letter due to my significant concerns with the redevelopment plans at Mount Edwards Court. I am a teacher at Christ Church Cathedral School and I wanted to ensure that you were made aware of the hardships the school is experiencing due to the present situation at Mount Edwards Court. School enrollment has significantly declined in the past year due to the change in use of Mount Edwards Court from a seniors' residence to supported housing. Because of this, the future viability of the school is now in jeopardy, staff employment is greatly at risk, and student safety and security is a growing concern.


Student safety and security is paramount to parents and staff alike. The proposed plans at Mount Edwards Court, if left unchanged, will cause hardship to many within our community and places some of the most vulnerable in society, our children, at great risk. These risks would be significantly reduced if a more appropriate use for Mount Edwards Court was found such as affordable housing for seniors, families, and single parents. I ask that council reconsider their present plans for Mount Edwards Court to further investigate other viable options.

The proposed number of 79 units of supported housing is almost double the current population and does not align with best practices by CMHC and other Cool Aid Facilities. Housing such a large population of hard-to-house residents with diverse needs, including drug use and addictions issues, right next to a K-8 school is unacceptable. The 844 Pandora Street facility with approximately 140 residents run by Portland Housing has been a disaster for the neighbourhood and general downtown core. Similar results are likely to occur if Mount Edwards Court were to expand to such a high number of residents.

As mentioned previously, many of the hard-to-house suffer from addiction issues including hard drugs. It is important to the safety and security of our students that absolutely no hard drug use is permitted anywhere near our school. The City has a 200-metre buffer zone around schools for pubs and marijuana dispensaries. As a community, we feel strongly that this should also apply to institutionalized use of hard drugs.

The current situation and proposed rezoning of Mount Edwards Court has had a detrimental effect on our school and community. I ask council to reconsider its position and seek an alternative use for this site in order find a solution that is acceptable to our school community. Thanks so much for your time and consideration of such an important issue.

Noraye:

The CALUC has reviewed the revised plans and would ask the Council to consider the comments we submitted on behalf of residents in this neighbourhood at the Community meeting and by email.

There are two major concerns we would like to highlight based on revised plans

1. **Privacy of neighbours on east and south.** The balconies on those sides of the building will over look already existing neighbours properties/house. In some cases, the view will be directly into rooms, or over gardens. This was raised at our meeting and was the subject of some concern from both neighbours. We would also point out that at time of original review we thought, assumed, especially given the address of the project and the location of entrances that the front of the building was on Fairfield road. In the revised plans, we note that the front is in fact Moss street so that the setbacks although all the same are now in places we did not expect and we also assume that the neighbours did not expect. Yes, the setbacks are all the same, except what we assumed was the front is now in fact a side yard set back and this also causes some concern because it places the building closer to Fairfield rd. than we assumed and also changes the relationship to the neighbours to the east and south. We realize this was not an intentional plan but the designation of what was front, back side etc. was left off original set of plans submitted to us. We assumed, from which we have learned to perhaps be more circumspect about plans submitted to us, but we ask you to look closely at those new, to us, set backs. You are aware of our concern about setbacks and we consider some of these to fall into that area of concern
2. **Parking Variance:** at the community meeting and in subsequent emails, parking was a major topic. The site in question is surrounded by no parking zones or residential restricted zones of varying degrees and as a result there is limited on street parking for several blocks around and this concern was raised consistently during the meeting and in our report. We understand, as does the applicant, that there was to be new parking requirements in Schedule C but those have yet to be approved and the existing requirements are in place now. We also understand the requirement of 43 stalls is derived by combining the residential spaces, the commercial and spaces for the church. At the meeting, there was much discussion about the church parking and how it was accepted now, and it is, but there are not the apartments nor the commercial activity at that site both of which will have a much bigger impact on parking than does the present stand-alone church. Also raised was the possibility of the church not continuing in that location. A change in use of that space or the church space being used for other purposes would exacerbate the parking with no prospect for alterations. On the other hand, if the church was to succeed and increase the number of parishioners above their currently low numbers the situation could be worse as regards parking. These factors lead

to much concern by neighbours and adjoining businesses. We ask you to consider any variances regarding parking quite closely as this project will have a major impact on Five Corners, and the school, neighbours and the businesses located nearby, as well as the crosswalks used by residents and the school.

We are a group of your neighbours and businesses that surround the Mt. Edwards Court at 1002 Vancouver Street as well as the parents of children that attend the Christ Church Cathedral School. We have been meeting every second Tuesday because Cool Aid called off the meetings after January

BC Housing and Cool Aid have been proposing their use of this building to Christ Church Cathedral School. However, there is a legal requirement for the government to engage in public consultation. This public consultation was lacking in February of 2016 when a temporary use permit was bestowed by the provincial and municipal governments to Cool Aid to operate a 38 person "no restriction" facility (allows illicit drug and alcohol use on site with no curfews or requirement for residents to become sober and drug free) in our residential neighbourhood and within 18 meters of an elementary school.

The temporary use permit and Cool Aid contract expired March 30th, 2017. There has been zero consultation in the decision to extend Cool Aid's contract and whether the facility will be allowed to continue operating. Cool Aid's contract has been extended. BC Housing has ignored our letters of opposition and request for consultation. Shane Ramsay, CEO of BC Housing canceled an agreed to meeting that he arranged on April 18th where we requested to meet to discuss our concerns.

Since we have been ignored, this is an opportunity to let our government know that we care about our neighbourhood and that introducing 100 over age 50 'no restriction' residents is unacceptable. Please read the statements below circling the statement that you agree with, sign and return to:

As a resident, business owner, or parent of a student near the Mount Edwards Court facility located at 1002 Vancouver Street, I believe: (Please choose one.)

1. BC Housing should return this facility to the population of seniors requiring assisted living and fully renovate into affordable living type suites for seniors. The BC Housing proposal for the covenant for no illicit drugs applied.
2. BC Housing should sell this building at 1002 Vancouver Street, move the current residents to the newly purchased Tally Ho motel on Douglas Street. The proceeds of the sale earmarked for better treatment facilities, affordable housing and prevention programming.
3. BC Housing should let Cool Aid run the facility as they have presented to Christ Church Cathedral School as a 76 resident (two floors) transitional housing facility for ages 50+ with a covenant on land title for no illicit drugs. Future plans are in place to develop the 3rd floor and increase density. Required monitoring by an external and independent party should be performed annually. Penalties for breach of monitoring this facility to be paid to the school for their bursary fund similar to the bond at Choices.
