Progress Update





Progress Update

- Significant progress made in construction of bridge foundation
- Fabrication of structural steel for bascule leaf continues
- City upgrades to 100-year-old water, sewer, and storm water will be complete by the end of April



Progress Update

- Project remains within budget of \$92.8 million with \$66 million for the construction budget
- Current accepted schedule has project completion March 2016



- City has received a Request for Change Order from the contractor requesting an increase of \$7.9 million and 5 ½ month extension to contract
- Change order requests are the typical means for contractors to present potential changes
- Change orders are not unusual for a project of this nature
- City has directed MMM to review and advise on merit of request



The City has a number of safeguards in place to protect taxpayers, such as:

- A fixed-price contract
- Owner-controlled insurance
- Legal expertise in construction law
- Fairness monitor hired to monitor procurement process



The City has a number of safeguards in place to protect taxpayers, such as:

- A contingency of \$2.8 million
- Regular audits in accordance with federal funding agreements
- Regular reporting in accordance with federal funding agreements



- The City is confident that the project can be completed within budget
- Bridge continues to be built to highest standards
- Once MMM has reviewed, staff will provide full report to Council on the request

Value Engineering

- Value Engineering continues on east abutment and rest pier.
 - east abutment \$150,000
 - rest pier \$60,000
- Savings of \$300,000 realized to date
- Completion expected by the end of April



Engineering Design Update

- At the time of the contract award design was 60% complete, sufficient to begin construction
- PCL's optimizations approved by Council required full design
- Bridge design is now complete with the exception of the pedestrian bridge, lighting, landscaping, and fendering



Status of Final Design

- Bascule Pier Foundations
- Main Truss and Ring
- Mechanical Package
- Approaches, Roads and Civil Works
- Bascule Pier

Design is complete with the following exceptions:

- Pedestrian Bridge
- Bridge Lighting
- Landscape
- Fendering




















Upcoming Construction Activity

- Continued procurement of mechanical and electrical elements




Upcoming Construction Activity

- Bus stop on east side of bridge to be relocated to Pandora Avenue
- BC Hydro will begin relocation of hydro duct on east side of bridge for power supply to new bridge this summer



Upcoming Construction Activity





- Continue to work with partners such as the DVBA and neighbourhood associations to communicate important information
- Recently followed up with neighbouring businesses regarding new timeline for completion of utility work



- Continue to reach out to neighbouring hotels
- Drop-in open house events planned for May
- Updated renderings of the public realm are expected in the coming weeks

BRIDGE CROSSING HISTORY

The existing Johnson Street Bridge opened to the public on January 11, 1924. It is the third bridge crossing built at its location.

Victoria Bridge 1855-1862

The first known crossing over the Gorge waterway was the Victoria Bridge – a low-level wagon bridge built from 1854 to 1855. By 1859 there were calls for its removal because it blocked boat access to the Upper Harbour. The Victoria Bridge was dismantled in 1862 and replaced with a ferry service.

Swing Bridge 1888-1923

In 1888, a swing bridge was built to provide the E&N Railway with access to downtown Victoria. Prime Minister Sir John A. Macdonald drove the last spike, marking the formal completion of the transcontinental railway, which had been a condition of British Columbia entering Canadian Confederation in 1871.
